

Nailsworth Quaker Meeting Role Description

Children and Young People's helper

How many:	Between nine and twelve.
What they do:	Follow the Area Meeting recruitment and appointment procedure. Lead or assist the leader when on the rota to run the children and young people's meeting. Keep details of children and volunteer helper attending and activities at the meeting. Know about and comply with Area Meeting guidelines about keeping children safe. Access resources and materials for children's work. (e.g. books and craft materials).
When they do it:	Children and Young People's Meeting on Sundays. Occasional Meetings organised by the Children and Young People's Committee.
Why they do it:	To provide care for the children of those who attend meeting with opportunities for them to learn about Quakers and Quakerism.
Resources:	Resources and materials are available online: Journeys in the Spirit Children and Young People. (www.quaker.org.uk/journeyschildren) Other materials and books are available in the Children's Meeting Room. New volunteer helpers will be given an induction by a designated volunteer helper or member of the Children and Young People's Committee. Training courses.
Budget:	There is an annual budget for Children and Young People's work.
Liaison with:	Children and Young People's Committee; Children and Young People's Work Advocate.
